RECAP

ROMANS

5:1-5

Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with **God** through our **Lord Jesus Christ**,² through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.³ And not only *that*, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance;⁴ and perseverance, character; and character, hope.⁵ Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the **Holy Spirit** who was given to us.

–**Justification** is God's act of removing the guilt and penalty of sin while at the same time declaring a sinner righteous through Christ's atoning sacrifice.
